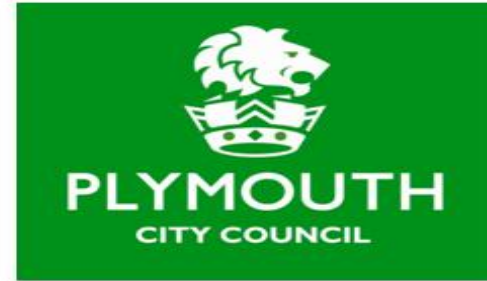

- Over a year of Emergency business support,
 - 13 different grants, over £80m distributed and over 16,505 businesses supported
- Resurgam Dashboard
 - 13,100 on Furlough (31st March) – down 1,700 from February
 - 10,120 Claimant Count (March) – 6.1%
- Though collaborating together- set a course for a fairer, greener and better future for Plymouth.

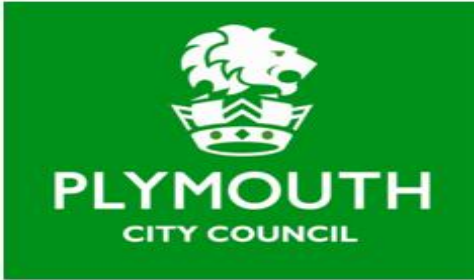

Brunel Plaza, Plymouth Station

- The University of Plymouth have started work on their Intercity Place project. The existing tower is being converted to provide a new home for the University's medical sciences faculty. Students will be able to start tuition here from Spring 2023 onwards.
- GWR's work to improve the existing concourse is also underway, with the new gateline due to be completed later this year.
- Plymouth City Council have started the formally planning process for the new multi-storey car park and will also be doing the same for new public realm, with plans to amend traffic movements through the site and create a high quality pedestrianised area outside the main concourse building.



Building 4 Plymouth



Forder Valley Link Road

- Total value of scheme **£52.8m**.
- Local employment is currently at **85%**.
- **58%** Local spend,
- **77%** labour within 40 miles and
- **70%** with SME's
- **100%** of construction waste diverted from landfill.
- Major milestone on Friday 14th May as work gets underway to install 28 concrete beams that will form the 140 metre bridge across the valley
- Despite the challenges of COVID19, the project is progressing well and is on track to open in 2022 as planned.
- It forms part of a wider package of measures that are key to unlocking growth in the north of Plymouth



City Centre Renaissance



- **£12m** from the Future High Streets Fund for the Civic Centre and Guildhall – City Living ,Conference centre
- Reopened 12th April for non essential retail
- Further lifting of restrictions for hospitality on **17th May**
- **The Box** £50m Museum, Gallery and Archive reopens 18th May
- **Geddon Plymouth** and Shop for Plymouth campaigns
- Two new **City Centre Hotels OYO and Premier Inn**
- New retail including; Cineworld, Hugo Boss, B&M, German Doner Kebab, Brewdog & more
- Meanwhile uses
- **£30m Health Hub** at Colin Campbell Court
- **£50m Barcode**
- **£80m Brunel Plaza**

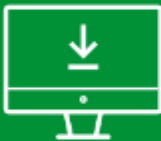

Maximising social value to benefit the City's economy, society and environment

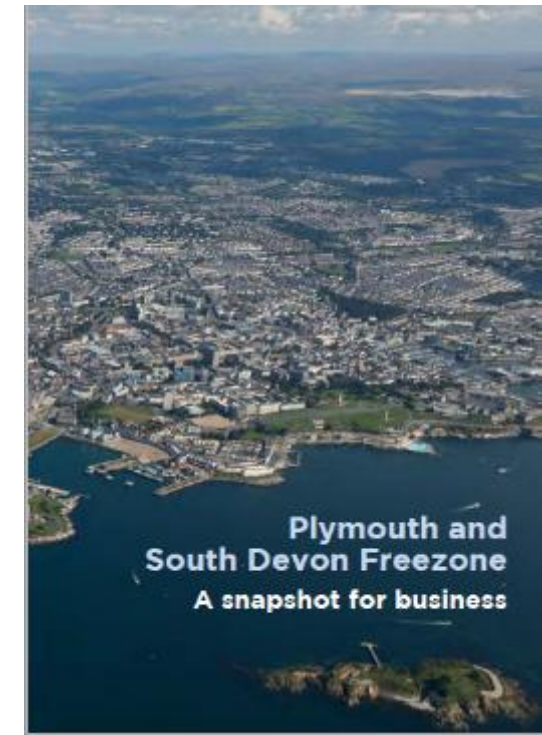
- **60%** of council spend so far this year with local suppliers in PL postcodes. **An increase of 12%**

Plymouth and South Devon “Freezone”

- We were announced as one of eight successful bids by HM government in March.
- Bid led by Plymouth City Council working with Devon and South Hams.
- We expect it to generate thousands of new jobs and over **£100m of new investment over the next 10 years** with a focus on clean growth and high quality jobs.
- Our Freezone will harness the power of Plymouth’s marine economy to drive economic growth and fund transport improvements that unlock underutilised employment land at Sherford and Langage.
- Our proposal directly targets key growth areas such as marine manufacturing, wind and wave energy and marine autonomy.
- **Open Stakeholder event 25th June** to co-design the business case with stakeholders
